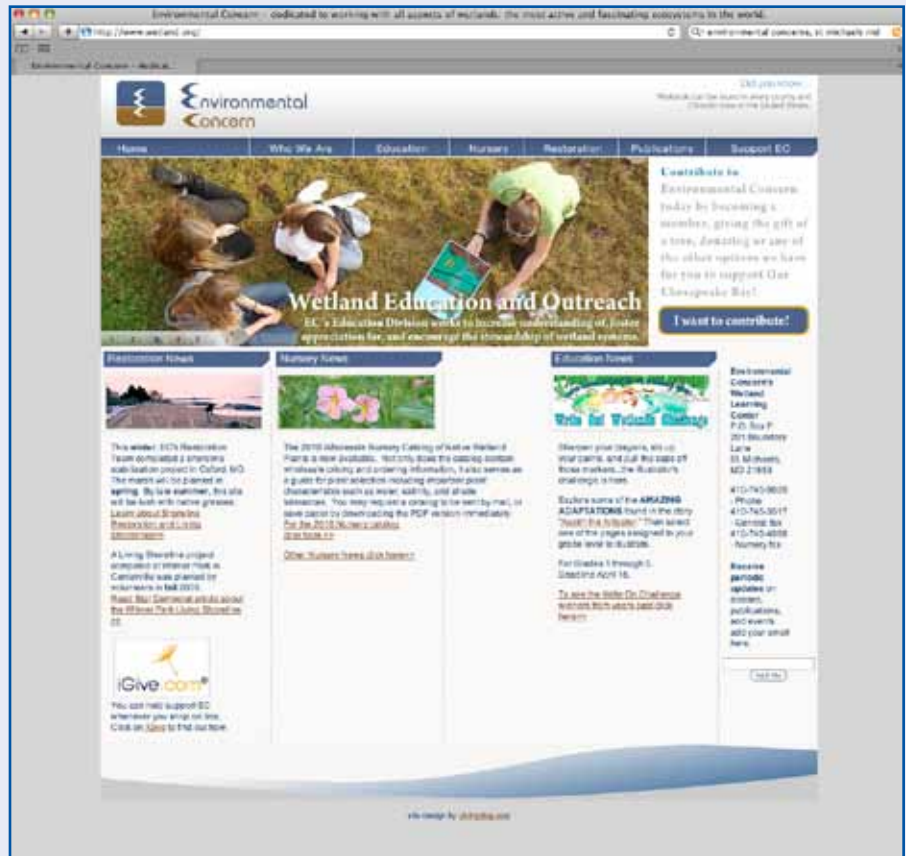

May's Program

May's program will take place at Environmental Concern's facility in St. Michaels at 5:30 p.m. Sarah Hilderbrand, Environmental Concern's Education Director, will present a program on rain gardens and rain barrels. If you're interested in purchasing a rain barrel, or taking a rain barrel course before the CWN program, let me know in advance. There is not a course scheduled after the May CWN program. Our next course is coming up on April 24th from 10 - 12 noon (cost \$35). When we receive a shipment of barrels, they don't last long!

BENEFITS OF HARVESTING RAINWATER

- Rain barrels are inexpensive and easy to install – they can easily be incorporated into existing gutter and drainage systems.
- Rain barrels conserve water and help lower water bill costs.
- Rain barrels reduce water pollution by reducing storm water runoff.
- Rain barrels save tax dollars by reducing or delaying the need to expand sewage treatment facilities.
- Rainwater stored in rain barrels is better for plants than municipally treated water.
