A long time advocate and volunteer in the world of learning differences, she is the founder of The Learning Connections, LLC, which is dedicated to helping adults, families, and students who struggle with ADHD. Beverly particularly enjoys working with clients to develop their strengths that lead them to more successful and satisfying lives. She also provides adult support groups locally and through teleconferencing.

A graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Beverly has also completed multiple and intensive training programs and graduate courses on learning styles, coaching, ADHD, neurodevelopment and parenting with such experts as Russell Barkley, Ph.D., Mel Levine, M.D., Patricia Quinn, M.D., Jane Nelson, Ph.D.,

and Edward "Ned" Hallowell, M.D. She has a coaching certificate from the Coaches Training Institute (CTI), is a graduate of the ADD Coach Academy (ADDCA) and is a Senior Certified ADHD Coach through the Institute for the Advancement of ADHD Coaches (IAAC). For three years, Beverly worked with psychiatrist Dr. Hallowell, renowned expert in ADHD and best selling author of recently released *Married to Distraction*, *Superparenting for ADD* and *CrazyBusy*, along with the classics, *Driven to Distraction* and *Delivered from Distraction*. A regular contributor to the *HealthWise* supplement of *The Star Democrat*, the largest newspaper in Talbot County, Beverly also serves on the Education Committee of the Mental Health Association of Talbot County. She recently served on the Board of Directors for the National Attention Deficit Disorder Association (ADDA) and Talbot Mentors (Easton, MD).

Beverly has more than 25 years of experience working with families, individuals, and students who struggle

with learning and achieving academic success, especially in the area of Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder. She actively presents workshops and lectures to schools and various organizations on all aspects of AD/HD, study skills and organization, positive parenting, and learning styles. Beverly also has extensive experience interacting with secondary schools and colleges who serve students with special needs, especially ADHD.

In her spare time, Beverly enjoys cooking, entertaining, family gatherings, gardening, home projects, reading, and sailing. She is active in her church and is a faithful Christian.
